

Lukasz Drozd is a visiting scholar from the Wharton School of the University of Pennsylvania. Lukasz received his Master's degree from the Warsaw School of Economics, and his PhD from the University of Minnesota. His first job was at the University of Wisconsin-Madison, starting in 2007, and he joined the Finance Department at the Wharton School in 2009. His research focuses on consumer finance, with a particular attention to bankruptcy regulation and unsecured credit markets. In his work, among other things, he studies the growth and expansion of the credit card market, its implications for personal bankruptcy statistics, and the role of technological progress and regulation in driving these recent changes. His other active area of research interest is international economics, within which he focuses on understanding the sources of deviations from the law of one price and international transmission of business cycle.
