

KONSTANTINOS SERFES is Associate Professor of Economics at the LeBow College of Business at Drexel University. His research interests lie in the areas of industrial organization, microeconomics and applied game theory. In particular, his current research employs game-theoretic models to examine issues in: i) price discrimination, ii) entrepreneurship, iii) information acquisition and sharing of customer-specific information, iv) bundling and a la carte pricing, v) two-sided markets, vi) principal-agent theory and matching models, and vii) in general, oligopoly models of strategic interaction. His work has appeared in the *Canadian Journal of Economics*, *Economic Theory*, *Economics Letters*, the *European Economic Review*, the *International Journal of Game Theory*, the *International Journal of Industrial Organization*, the *Journal of Development Economics*, the *Journal of Industrial Economics* and the *Journal of Economics & Management Strategy*. He holds a Ph.D. in Economics and a M.S. in Mathematics from the University of Illinois at Champaign-Urbana and a B.A. and a M.A. in Economics from the Athens University of Economics and Business.
